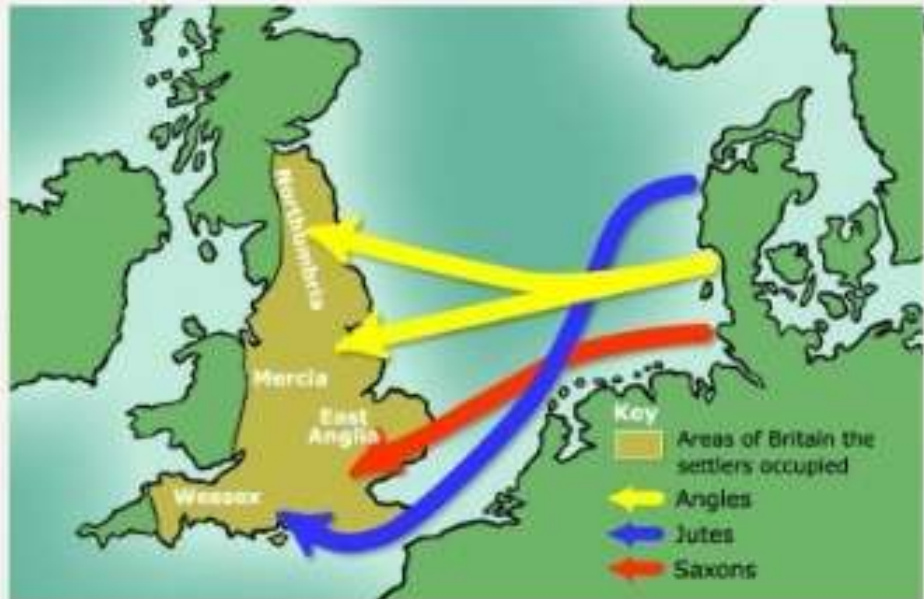

# \*Map of Jutland

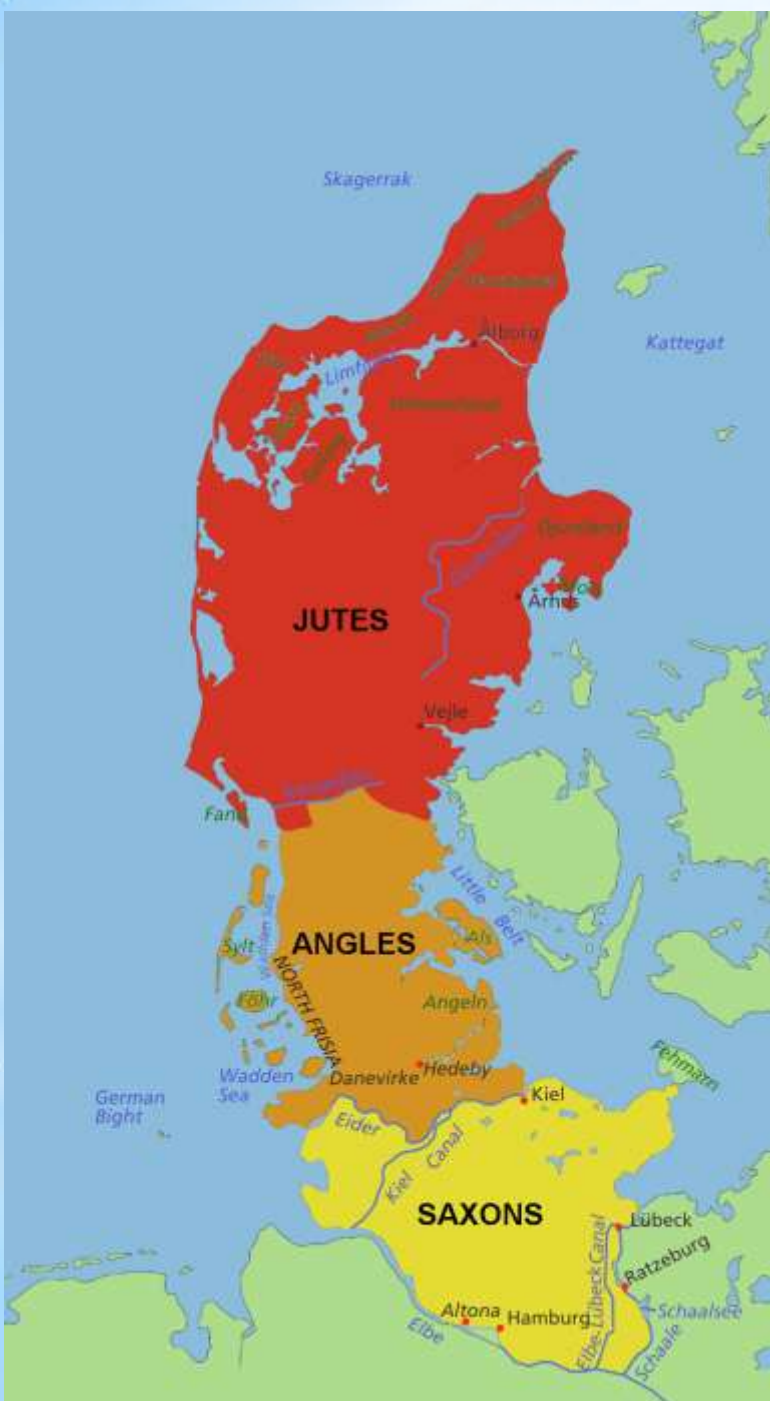






\* Saxon, Angli and Jute warriors


