He was the second son of Vlad Dracul (dragon), who became the ruler of Wallachia in 1436. His hard childhood taught him cruelty. During his period of rule he committed the atrocities for which he was best known. His penchant for impaling his enemies on stakes in the ground and leaving them to die earned him the name Vlad the Impaler (Romanian: Vlad Ţepeș).

(13) In 1460 Turkish sultan Mehmet II wanted to invade the capital of Wallachia, Targoviste. When he achieved the town's walls, he saw an awful scenery.

(14) Vlad III was dining surrounding thousands of stakes with impaled people. They were exuding a detestable smell, their bodies were corrupting. A Turkish sultan was frightened to enter the town. That year Vlad escaped Ottomans. He inflicted this type of torture on foreign and domestic enemies. His famous phrase was: "Kill yours to frighten the others".

You may ask:" So what's the similarity between the real Dracula and the imaginary one?" (15) He drank blood of his enemies as well as a book character.

He was so savage, that the name Dracula would never be forgotten.

Despite his cruelty he was an extremely best ruler.
