

My time travel

- * Communal apartments with shared kitchen and toilet were not conducive to a comfortable standard of living. Crowded public transportation (private cars were very rare) did not help either. Work depended whether you worked in a factory or in an office, but people did not seem to work too hard or cared too much about the outcome, a saying in Soviet Union was: "They pretend to pay us and we pretend to work." Dinner was as good as one could cook in a crowded communal kitchen and TV, when it was available, was mostly concerts and comedies in black and white.



- * Yet, we were happy, because, growing up, we were looking forward to the romantic adventures and the exciting future. We were proud of Yuri Gagarin and other cosmonauts. We were dreaming of exploring new planets and new horizons. We have started to copy and listen to Beatles and rock-n-roll music, we had read and listened to our own poets and bards. We watched sports and were proud of Soviet sport achievements. We did not understand the politics yet and did not care about it, until the life hit us in the face.
